The *Textual History of the Bible* brings together for the first time all available information regarding the manuscripts, textual history and character of each book of the Hebrew Bible and its translations as well as the deuterocanonical scriptures. In addition, *THB* covers the history of research, the editorial history of the Hebrew Bible, as well as other aspects of text-critical research and its subsidiary fields, such as papyrology and codicology.

Volume 2 provides the reader with an unprecedented wealth of textual information about the deuterocanonical books of the Old Testament, that is, all the books outside the Hebrew canon that were considered canonical by any church at any given time. For the first time all textual witnesses of all deuterocanonical books are surveyed and analyzed whose origins date back at least to the tenth century C.E. Vol. 2A covers the canonical history of the deuterocanonical books and engages with their textual histories in each language tradition. Vols. 2B and 2C address the textual history of each deuterocanonical book in greater detail. Separate articles deal with each version in which a deuterocanonical book is attested.

Frank Feder, Ph.D. (2002), is senior academic researcher and project coordinator of the academy project *Complete Digital Edition and Translation of the Coptic-Sahidic Old Testament* at the Göttingen Academy of Sciences and Humanities and lecturer for Egyptology and Coptology at the University of Göttingen. He has published extensively on the Coptic Bible and Ancient Egyptian Literature and he is co-editor of the series *Texts and Studies on the Coptic Bible*.

Matthias Henze is Isla Carroll and Percy E. Turner Professor of Hebrew Bible and Early Judaism and Founding Director of the Program in Jewish Studies at Rice University in Houston, Texas. He has published extensively on the Hebrew Bible, the literature of Second Temple Judaism, and the Pseudepigrapha. He is the editor-in-chief of the *Journal for the Study of the Pseudepigrapha*.
