

TEXTUAL HISTORY OF THE BIBLE

A Companion to Textual Criticism, Vol. 3A

The *Textual History of the Bible* brings together for the first time all available information regarding the manuscripts, textual history and character of each book of the Hebrew Bible and its translations as well as the deuterocanonical scriptures. In addition, *THB* covers the history of research, the editorial history of the Hebrew Bible, as well as other aspects of text-critical research and its subsidiary fields, such as papyrology and codicology.

Volume 3 (*A Companion to Textual Criticism*) addresses a range of other matters that pertain to modern textual criticism.

THB 3A (*The History of Research of Textual Criticism*) offers the first comprehensive survey to date of the history of research on the textual criticism and textual history of the Hebrew Bible, its deuterocanonical scriptures, and its versions in both Judaism and Christianity. It includes overview articles of the history of the text-critical study of the Hebrew Bible and its ancient versions by both Jewish and Christian scholars, covering all text-critical and text-historical research from Antiquity until the present day.

Armin Lange (General Editor, Volume Editor) is professor for Second Temple Judaism and Antisemitism Studies at the University of Vienna, a member of the international team editing the Dead Sea Scrolls and a corresponding member of the Austrian Academy of Sciences. His research focuses on the Hebrew Bible, its textual criticism, ancient Jewish literature, and antisemitism.

Russell E. Fuller (Volume Editor) is professor of Hebrew Bible in the Department of Theology and Religious Studies at the University of San Diego. He is a member of the international editorial team for the Dead Sea Scrolls. His research focuses on the textual criticism of the Hebrew Bible.
